

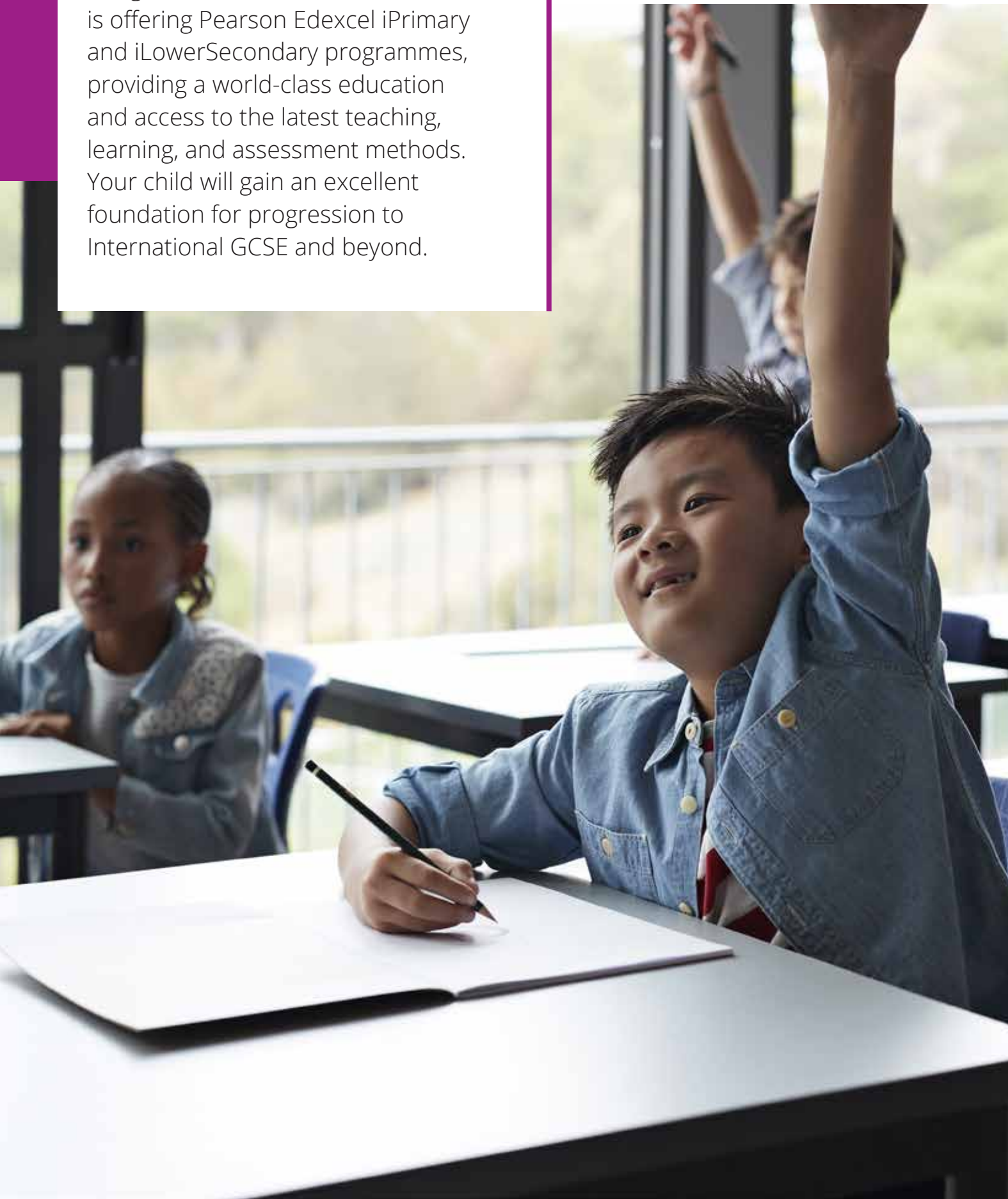

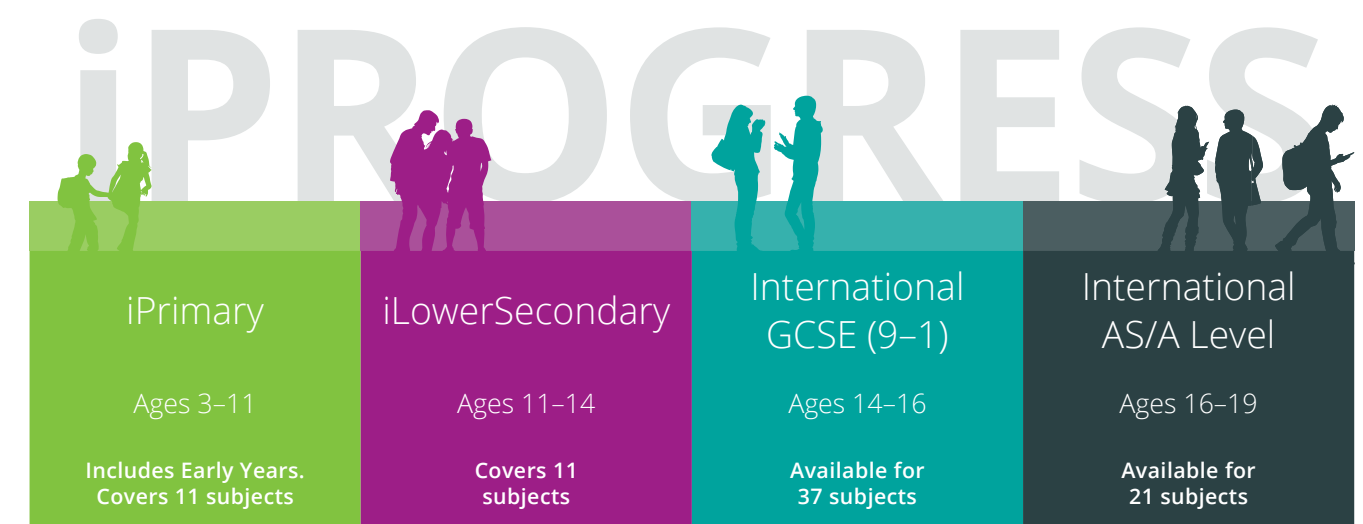
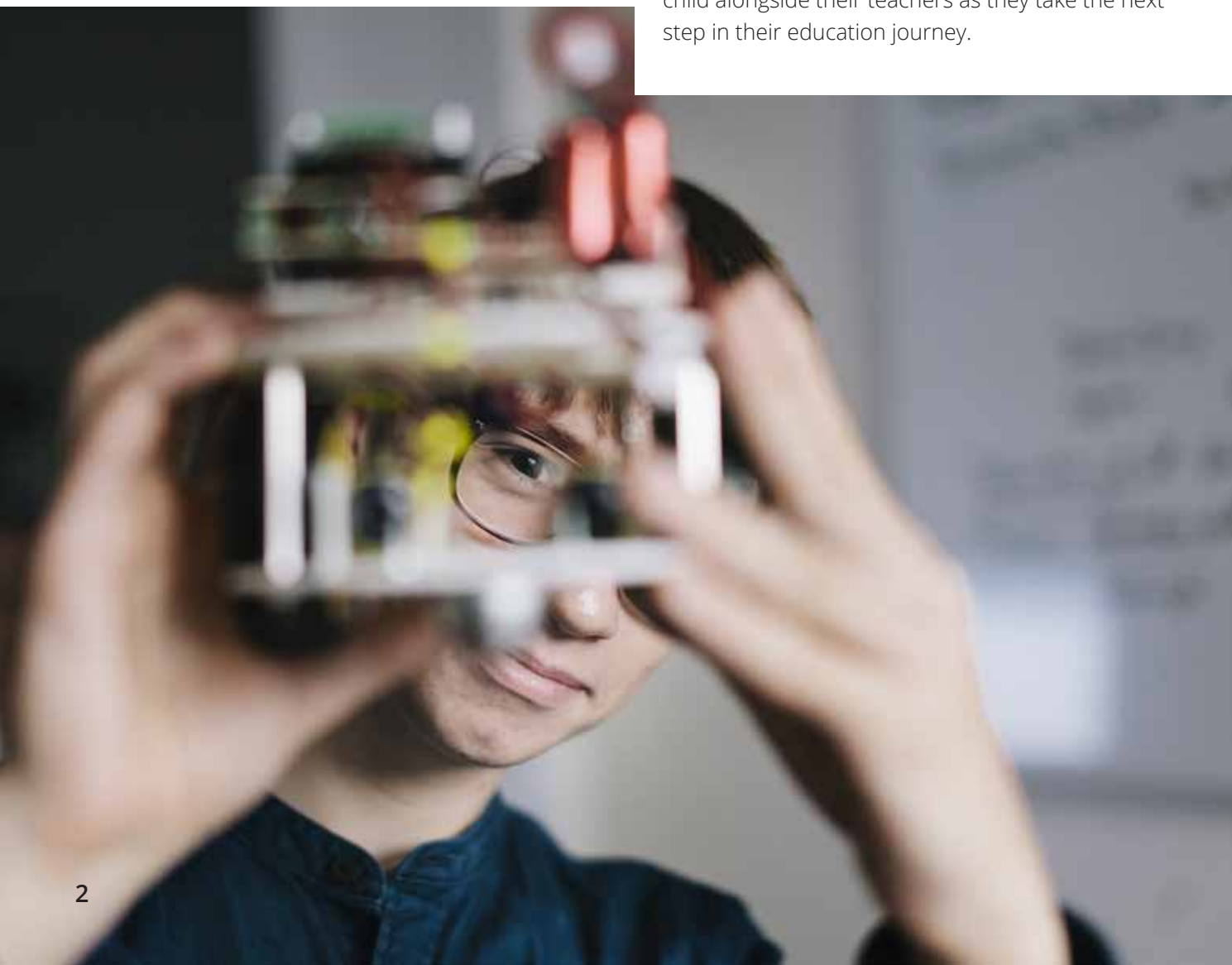
Laying the foundation for future success

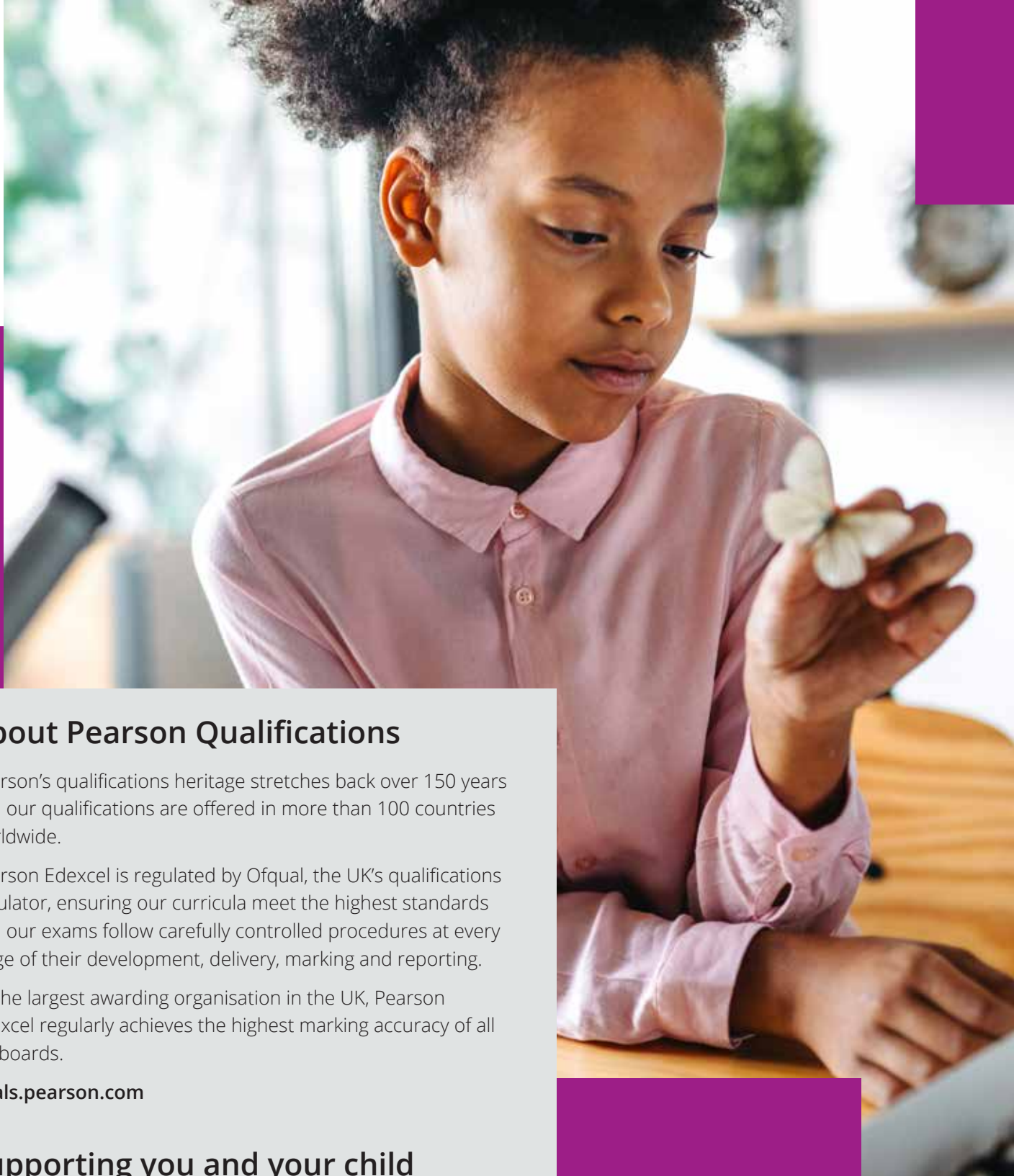
